The new session of the Glenfarg group of the Riding for the Disabled Association begins at the riding stables on Monday 27th April.

On Monday mornings between 10.30am and 12.30pm children from Cherrybank school for the mentally handicapped come to ride followed by children with discipline problems from Caledonian Road Primary School in Perth. A similar session on Tuesday mornings takes more children from Cherrybank School followed by physically handicapped children from Viewlands Primary School in Perth. On Wednesday evenings between 7.15pm an,] 9.00pm handicapped adults from Upper Springlands in Perth come to ride.

Altogether up to 58 handicapped adults and children are able to ride each week. As you can imagine with up to 3 helpers required for each rider a large number of volunteer are required to help. To mark the International Year for the Disabled, Glenfarg R.D.A. group is organising an intergroup riding competition to be held in Wallace Park on Sunday 28th June.
