These dogs must be owned by local people, but undoubtedly by an unthinking, and perhaps uncaring, minority who allow their animals to spoil the pleasures and amenities of our Village for the majority. There are new laws that permit prosecutions to be made, but can we appeal once again to your community spirit and better nature, so that this problem can be resolved once and for all, and to the advantage of all in Glenfarg.
