EDITORIAL It may have come to notice that each succeeding issue of the Newsletter increases in its contents, and for this we are grateful to the officials of local organisations who contribute the information contained in the N/L. However, with the increase in the size of the publication, printing costs increase, and since the introduction of the 'new format', costs have increased more than double. The N/L is free of charge, and will continue to be so, as long as revenue from advertising and the collecting box in the Post Office cover the cost of printing. Many people ask 'Why not charge for the N/L?' but there are certain problems arising from this, the revenue accruing from a charge, would not compensate for the present system of distribution, and for this we are most grateful to John and Eric Reid of the Post Office for their invaluable assistance. It may be of interest to know that the cost of printing each copy of the NIL is 27 pence, 400 being printed, and distributed as follows, 300 Glenfarg, Kinross 45, Abernethy 25, Bridge of Earn 15, and 15 copies to 'exiled', Glenfargites, mostly now living in England etc, and still interested in local affairs. Finally our thanks to Craig and his staff of 'Word Perfect', at Kinross, who print the N/L at a 'bargain price', with very little profit for their excellent service.

COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

A meeting of the GLENFARG COMMUNITY COUNCIL, was held in the village hall on Monday, 10th July 1988, at 7.30 pm, in the presence of 8 Councillors, apologies being received from Cllr Mrs J. Thompson, Sir Alan Smith Regional Cllr, and Mrs R. Ferrand, District Cllr, also present. 18 members of the public attended. The Chairman Mr Lindsay welcomed the company, congratulating Mrs Ferrand on her re-election to the District Council, and commented on the large attendance of the general public, which increases at each succeeding C.C. Meeting. The minutes of the meeting of 9 May 1988, having been circulated, it was proposed and seconded that they 'be taken as read', Approved.

Mr John Sinclair, the Acting Secretary, outlined in great detail, matters concerning the following matters:- Prior to this, the Chairman welcome to the meeting, Mr Clive Kent, of Perth District Planning Dept., who dealt with matters arising from Right of Ways, a subject to be discussed at the meeting. It was envisaged that 24 of the R of Ws would be reduced to a 'workable' 7, which might be walked by villagers and tourists to Glenfarg. Cllr Hume had distributed questionnaires to local people who had walked over the 7 designated routes in the past 20 years, in order that the right to them could be 'asserted'. Mr Sinclair then went on to outline details and queries regarding Tayside Structure Plan, intended submission of planning for inner areas of the village, this includes the old school playground behind the village hall, and sites likely to become available for tourists to come through Glenfarg, Leisure and Recreation, with special reference to the reinstatement of the Wallace Park, on the completion of the new tennis complex, Public Utilities, such as toilets in the centre of the village, street lighting, Hayfield Road, and the Ladeside to the Gallow Hill Estate.



The Chairman & Committe Members,
Glenfarg United Amateur Football Club,
Glenfarg.

9th July 1988

Ladies & Gentlemen,

I write this letter out of concern for the Glenfarg Football Club and the local community who's name it carries.

There would appear to be a lack of strong leadership due to difference of opinion within the management which has led to piece meal policy, resulting in controversial player selection. It would appear that there has been no regard whatever to introducing young local talent, who, I have been assured, show ability, and who would have been proud to pull on a Glenfarg Shirt. The result of this disregard of local opinion has been shown in the lack of support, this being the only way members of the community can register their protest at the way tie team is now being run.

In applauding the efforts of those who gain sponsorships for the club, at the start and during the season, I should like to stress that paying the expenses and buying the meals for those players who travel the 60/70 miles to play would put a heavy financial burden on club funds, this can only result in a deficit on the books at the end of the season. I am however aware that there are those who bear their own expenses, and they are to be commended, as their interest is obviously in the sporting activity and not the gain.

I would have thought that the aim of an amateur village football club such as we have in Glenfarg would, of course, be to win but more importantly would be to engender a feeling of fellowship and cameraderie within the club, also to promote local playing talent which in turn would encourage local support, hence bringing about a major increase in the club's income through that local support.

Standing in the sidelines, as it were, I have noticed that the club projects an image of in-fighting and bickering which this year has culminated in a very disappointing turnout at the annual football dance with very few players and wives in attendance, and even fewer locals of which there are normally many to swell the numbers.
