COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

A meeting of the C.C. was held in the village hall on Wednesday 7th September, 1988, when over 60 members of the public attended, the largest number attending a C.C. meeting. Also in attendance were Mrs. Ferrand, District Cllr., Mr. R. Bean, Deputy Director P & K District Council of the Planning Dept., together with Community Cllrs. Apologies being received from Sir Alan Smith and Cllr. George Ross.

The Chairman welcomed the meeting, which opened with the Acting Secretary, John Sinclair, tendering his resignation, reminding the meeting that when he accepted office it was for a limited period only. He now felt that the time had come for that period to come to an end. He would remain on the Council to assist in any way that it was considered necessary. The Chairman stated that he regretted Mr. Sinclair's decision, and said that since taking over as secretary, the village had gained much from his previous experience of public service and the meetings large attendance was proof of the interest he had created in the village. His expertise would be sorely missed, especially by the Chairman who had found that working alongside Mr. Sinclair had given him a further insight into public service.

District Councillor Mrs. Ferrand stated although no reply had been received by the Secretary from District Council approving the change from 3-monthly meetings to bimonthly meetings, she understood that approval had been given.

Mr. Bean then addressed the meeting, presenting a plan outlining, after consultation with interested parties, a tentative proposal for the development of the vacant coal-yard and adjoining field, should the owners be prepared to sell the land. This plan incorporated the 'Old School Playground' complex.

The Tennis Club were granted half of the money to purchase new equipment for the multi-sports complex. This grant would come from the accumulated funds held in the Newsletter Account.



ARNGASK CHURCH

In September 1599 a group of London merchants pooled £30,000 for a voyage to the East Indies and shortly after received a charter from Elizabeth I and so the East India Company was formed. What is most interesting to know is that the aim of the company was set no higher than carrying on a 'quiet trade' with no desire to interfere with anyone else's business. No one could have imagined just what an influence the East India Company would eventually have on the history of Britain and India and such an impact on world trade and commerce. This picture of the small and apparently insignificant was a favourite of Christ's. The mustard seed - as small as a pin head - when grown to full maturity is large enough for birds to nest in its branches. The leaven used by the housewife in breadmaking permeates the mass of dough till the whole is ready to bake. All true artists and craftsmen know the secret of paying attention to detail, of looking closely and carefully. Taking care, taking pains are acts of faith - faith in ourselves and faith in life. It was the genius of William Blake that he saw "A World in a grain of sand, And a Heaven in a Wild Flower." In recent years I have often thought that we suffer greatly from taking life in too large chunks. We are constantly being fed large numbers whether it is deficits, surpluses, unemployed, homeless, starving, and the need to meet these large human predicaments with large nation or world-wide solutions. For the sake of our own mental and emotional health and happiness we have to hold to our faith in Christian values and the values of our own land and the good wholesome things in the world of nature. Life starts with ourselves, with our homes, with the people close to us who love us and want the best for us. Sometimes young people have difficulty finding something they want to do, hard to come by. It can be frustrating and a difficult time at home. Whether we have work to do or not we are still precious in ourselves and still God's children. The Church is a place where our identities are cherished and valued for themselves. I sincerely believe that all life at its highest and best is 'a quiet trade', a peacefulness in our souls that nothing can rob us of. The

THE ARMY CADET FORCE

The Army Cadet Force is a youth organisation funded by the Ministry of Defence whose aims are "to produce a fit young man with an understanding of basic military subjects, initiated into the art of leadership, aware of his responsibilities as a citizen and with a well developed interest in the Army and the community".

It is not a recruiting organisation for the Armed Services. Having been in the Army Cadet Force in no way commits a young person to service in any of the Regular, Territorial or Reserve Forces. Although the "Aims of Training" talks of "young men" girls are now admitted in some Detachments, although the nearest Detachment admitting girls in Kirkcaldy. It is hoped, however, within the next year, for girls to be admitted into Perth Academy Detachment.

The position for boys is much better. Not only are there 4 Detachments in Perth itself but, somewhat closer to hand, Kinross has a Detachment which parades every Wednesday night at 1930.

The type of training undertaken is varied. The standard Military subjects of Drill, Weapon Training, Shooting, Map and Compass and Fieldcraft feature along with Adventurous Training (camperraft to you and me) First Aid and Citizenship. These are the compulsory subjects but the local Battalion also has specialist instructors in Canoeing, Rock Climbing and Abseiling, P.T., Assault Courses and Survival Skills. We also have access to a Regular Army Team qualified in skiing, Windsurfing and Orienteering.

One of the benefits of being Army Sponsored (other than the Adults getting paid!) is that the opportunities outside the Battalion are limitless. Every year Cadets from this Battalion visit Belgium and Germany; and some have also visited Canada. A large number of Regular Army Courses are available covering things such as Car Mechanics, Electronics, Combat Engineering, Cooking etc. The MOD funding also means that the cost to cadets of Weekend Camps and Annual Camps is very low. A weekend Friday night to Sunday afternoon






