

COMMUNITY COUNCIL NEWS

The C.C. held its bimonthly meeting on 3rd May, 1989 in the village hall. Cllr J.M. Lindsay in the chair, secretary G Drysdale, Treasurer R Millar, and Cllrs Mrs V Baird, Mrs J Thompson, C Brough, R Millar, S Mee, J Sinclair and G Ross.

By Invitation - Mrs L Graham, District Councillor, Mrs B Templeton, and the Rev T W Tait, representing Perth & Kinross Local Health Council.

Apologies for absence - Cllr A R McFarlane, Sir A Smith

The Chairman extended a warm welcome to the newly appointed Community Cllrs, and to Mrs Graham, the newly elected District Councillor. To Mrs B Templeton, the Rev T W Tait, and 23 members of the public.

Items discussed were as follows:-

The reps from the Health Council has been asked to come along by the C.C. to assist in what way they could to discuss the lack of any system of collection and delivery of a 'prescription service' in the village. After a long discussion, the Rev Tait suggested that as the Tayside Health Board were sensitive to adverse publicity, a village petition should be organised expressing the communities dissatisfaction with the present medical facilities. This to be organised by the Community Council.

MAINS GAS SUPPLY

A letter from the British Gas Board was read out, wherein it stated that a survey would be carried out by them in early 1989. We are still waiting, now well into early 1989.

CONVENTION OF COMMUNITY COUNCILS

The secretary reported on the AGM of the above convention. Discussed was:- possible closure threats to certain outlying hospitals, down grading of sub post offices, and other items concerning Community Councils.

TAYSIDE STRUCTURE PLAN

The convenor of the sub-committee Cllr Sinclair, stated that the committee had not yet met. A few submissions had been received, an excellent one from Mr Alan Fairweather but a few more would be welcome.

ARNGASK PRIMARY SCHOOL

The treasurer gave an account of the money to be allotted for school prizes, the amount to be £105. The chairman reported he had discussed with Mrs Bruce, the Headmistress the proposal by the C.C.



that some expression of thanks be made in respect of the District Council service that the late Mrs Rosemary Ferrand had given to the village. It was agreed that the sum of money to be donated by the C.C. would be used to buy a cine screen for use in the school, on which would be affixed a commemorative plate bearing the inscription "Provided by Glenfarg Community Council in Memory of Mrs Rosemary Ferrand, District Councillor." Agreed by the Council.

RIGHTS OF WAYS IN GLENFARG

The Chairman expressed his thanks and that of the C.C. to Mr Ian Hume, who had retired at the AGM as he was shortly to be leaving the village to live in Perth. Ian has been the prime mover in ensuring the Right of Way's in the village had been asserted, and his knowledge of them would be sadly missed. The Council wish Ian and Christine a very happy future in Perth. Mrs Innes of Glendeuglie estate expressed concern regarding the possibility of persons using the unratified R of W on her property, and the possibility of them being injured by animals in her field. In reply it was stated that any person using the R of W did so at their own risk.

VILLAGE SKIP

Clr Brough drew attention of the meeting to recent misuse of the skip, such as leaving rubbish by the skip, when it was already full. The misuse referred to, displayed a lack of common sense, and lack of consideration, and created a nuisance (from wind blown refuse) to the residents who live close by the skip. Cllr Brough appealed to all persons using the skip to show more care and consideration. An appeal which was endorsed by the Council. It could be if further complaints were received from nearby residents, consideration could be given for it to be removed, and that after our efforts to have it in the village, would be a great loss.

RAINBOW GUIDES

An appeal was made by the leaders of the newly formed Rainbow Guides for a donation of £50 to buy items for their use. Cllr Mrs Thompson, seconded by Cllr Mee that the donation be £60, but the amendment was lost on a vote. The Council then approved the grant of £50.

COMMUNITY CHARGE

A. member of the public raised the question of the 55p charge made by the Post Office when paying the community charge. Some regions pay the 55p Transcash charge, but Tayside is not one of them, therefore apart from a Direct Debit through a bank, the only means of making payment in Glenfarg is either by post or across the Post Office counter, which incurs the 55p charge, and residents who use the latter method feel they are being treated unfairly. It was agreed that the secretary write to the Tayside Regional Council, and the Post office to see whether an arrangement similar to that operating in other regions be implemented in Tayside Region. This was approved by the Council.

NEW IMPROVED REPEAT PRESCRIPTION SERVICE

Due to the pressure on the surgery switchboard the doctors are adopting a new repeat prescription system as from the 1st July 1989. Patients will be issued with a prescription card on which will be the written names of the drug prescribed, the number of times that have to be taken each day, and the number of days supplied. This card should be taken or posted to the surgery, enclosing a note of the items required, and a stamped addressed envelope if the prescription is to be posted back. This should be done about ONE WEEK before the existing medicines run out.

If delivered to the surgery by 1.00 pm prescriptions will be ready for collection by 11.00 am the following morning.

SATURDAY MORNINGS Prescriptions may be uplifted on Saturday mornings if ordered before 1.00 pm on Friday.

On Saturdays, no orders will be taken for prescription requests however. AT NO TIME AFTER 1ST JULY 1989, WILL PRESCRIPTION REQUESTS BY TELEPHONE BE ACCEPTED.



RURAL TAYSIDE COMMUNITY AWARD SCHEME

Tayside Regional Council, Rural Affairs Committee, has developed a scheme which is aimed at helping rural communities (such as Glenfarg), to finance projects which are of local benefit. The committee has a budget of £10,000 with which to assist in funding projects which are of social, economic, or environmental benefit to the community. The scheme is dependent on the applicant or organisation matching 'pound for pound' up to a maximum of £750. The award must be taken up within a period of 6 months. Application to be in by 6th June, 1989. Examples of types of projects likely to receive an award are, lunch clubs, local histories, tidying up open spaces, and craft clubs etc. It should be noted, however, that routine repairs to property, (eg halls are NOT eligible for grant). This is an excellent opportunity for organisations in Glenfarg who qualify to make the application for such grant. 

PLANNING IN GLENFARG

Outline planning permission in the name of M Harland, 'Folda', Church Brae, has been submitted to the P&KDC for the following. "Proposed new jewellery studio and conversion of existing garages to a residential unit at Church Brae." In addition there will be parking space for 7 cars.

COMMUNITY CHARGE (POLL TAX)

Some concern was raised by a member of the public at the last Community Council meeting, at the 55p charge pensioners are FORCED to pay when paying the above tax at Post Offices. The council have written to the Tayside Regional Council and the Post Office protesting against the charge, pointing how unfair the charge is when other regions are paying the 40p charge the Post Office requires from regions for handling the payment at Post Offices. The region state that the charge of 40p is excessive, and would add millions to the cost of collecting the community charge, therefore the poor old age pensioners have to pay 55p.

Some sub postmasters had installed Handtill service in their shops, where by a direct payment could be made into the box, thus saving any charge, apart from some sub post offices these handtills are placed in other places such as Wm Low's supermarket etc, however those to be found in the sub post offices MUST now be removed by ORDER of the Post Office, if not removed the sub postmaster will be asked to resign. So much for Democracy.

SOUTH INCH CAR PARK, PERTH

The car park which is leased by Perth & Kinross District Council from Tayside Regional Council is a long term parking area free of charge, much used by tourists and rural visitors to Perth. Should the rental be increased considerably, there is the possibility the National Car Park PLC might take it over, with the result that a charge would be made for parking. This charge would be very much to the detriment of the rural community who came to Perth to do their shopping. Glenfarg C.C. have written to the Convention of Community Councils to voice their concern, and to bring this concern to the notice of the authorities.


