





These are what I picked from the Bank House garden on 13 January. Starting with the large marbled leaf, and going clockwise their names are: Arum Italicum Pictum, Hamamelis Mollis (Wych Hazel), Garrya Elliptica, Helleborus Niger (Christmas Rose), snowdrops and Jasminum Nudiflorum (Winter Jasmine). In a normal January most of these would be tight shut due to cold, or buried in snow, but in this mild one things are flowering a month early. Maybe by the time you

read this in February we will be experiencing the frost we need to kill some of the hibernating garden pests, and halt the premature sprouting of green shoots that are bound to be frosted later. The morning after I drew this, the hanging Garrya catkins had stretched in the warmth by two inches, flopping on the table and releasing a cloud of yellow pollen dust.

Glenfarg Presentation Clock

“Presented to Mr. David Rintoul, Letter Carrier, as a token of public esteem for 25 years’ faithful services at Glenfarg, 20th March 1891”

She would like to contact any relative who might still be living in Glenfarg. Further details are available from Mr. Ross, the Schoolhouse.

Community Council

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held in the Village Hall on 5 January 1998, at which 24 members of the public were present. Cllr. Mrs. Janet Law (District Councillor), Mr. J. Lochhead (P&K Council Planning Dept) and Mr. J. Stephen (A&J Stephen) were present by invitation.

PERTH AND KINROSS COUNCIL BUDGET AND FINANCE There was no representative from the Finance Dept. of Perth & Kinross Council at this meeting as there had been a misunderstanding over the date and place. There will be public meetings in the Town Hall, Kinross on 10 February, and in Bridge of Earn on 16 February, and it was hoped that representatives of Glenfarg CC would be able to attend.

PLANNING In a wide-ranging address Mr. Lochhead dealt with the Structure Plan and the Local Plan and their relationship to each other. There is a shortage of building land in Perthshire and Kinross. On this account the Council Planners are restricted in trying to meet the housing requirements of the district – those requirements

being specified by the Scottish Office. Furthermore the planners’ proposals do not necessarily become adopted by the elected members of the council as the council’s formal housing policy. Mr. Lochhead then referred to some of the on-costs consequential to the development of housing e.g. the provision of educational facilities. He was dismissive of the popular myth that much housing is occupied by commuters, and pointed out that, according to the Council’s records, 85% of the working population of the Perth area and its environs (but not Kinross) actually work in the Perth area. Also, far from the area being a favoured location for retirees, only 9% of the population are in the “third age” group.

Numerous questions were asked relating to the future development of Glenfarg. Mr. Lochhead urged the audience to visit the Planning Dept. representatives at the Glenfarg Hotel on 22 January. He mentioned that, by law, objections to planning proposals can only be sustained on planning grounds – community, social and environmental grounds are insufficient in themselves unless they can be linked with planning grounds. Proposed development at the south end of Glenfarg, adjoining



Wallace Park, was discussed briefly and unconvincingly. In answer to a question from the Chairman Mr. Lochhead conceded that the planning process is loaded in favour of the developer, but he urged the CC to become involved in the planning process in relation to the area it serves.

DEVELOPMENT Mr. Stephen said that the purpose of his address was to correct a number of mis-statements, made by the Chairman in the November edition of the Glenfarg newsletter, about his company's activities in Glenfarg. He pointed out that the "Glenfarg Precedent" referred to the High Court judgement against P&K Council, and not against his company. He denied that his

company was involved in building a "vast number of houses at the south end of Wallace Park", and queried the Chairman's assertion that inadequate natural drainage will lead to the existing sewerage arrangements being inadequate. He stated that drainage is the responsibility of NOSWA.

Various members of the public asked Mr. Stephen about future developments. Mr. Stephen agreed that there is some scope for a greater variety of style and range of houses in future development, but he was adamant that under present day costs there is no scope for starter homes or houses for the aged. These categories of people would find suitable accommodation in flats in Perth.

Sunday School / Bible Class

The new term commenced on 11 January with a later starting time. The Church Service and Sunday School (age 3 – 11) start at 11am, and the Bible Class (secondary school pupils) now starts at 10.15am. All children from 3 upwards are very welcome. Come and join our varied activities including music, singing, stories and other ways of showing that the Bible is alive today!





Riding for the Disabled – Glenfarg Group

1997 was a very active year for Glenfarg RDA. We provided rides for nearly 80 riders from April to December during school terms, and for 30 or so in the spring term.
