

Police Box

CHRISTMAS MESSAGE All readers will be well aware that Christmas is just around the corner. This time of year is of particular concern to the Police, as we do not want this special occasion ruined by the criminal element.

It is no secret that many criminals are not content to obtain presents legitimately, and often resort to breaking into homes, where they know that luxury items, such as televisions, video recorders, music centres and the like, are in abundance. Not only that, but Christmas presents are left in full view under Christmas trees.

The long, dark nights mean that homes are often left in darkness while the occupants are out at work.

It is to this end that the public and the Police need to work in conjunction with each other.

- ◆ The first step is to make sure that your house is less likely to be targeted. Remember it is your property, and you are in the best position to look after it.
- ◆ Leave one or more lights on, preferably operated by a timer switch.
- ◆ Install security lights to either side, and rear of your house.
- ◆ Make sure that all doors and windows are kept locked.
- ◆ Pay particular attention to strangers in the area, and please – and this is important – report anything suspicious to the Police immediately.
- ◆ If you see a person or vehicle that you're not happy with, note a description of the person and registration number of the vehicle, and report it.

It is of little use contacting the Police some time later, and reporting something suspicious. I know that many people will be scared of wasting Police time, but we would rather check out people and vehicles at the time – it deters criminals from frequenting the area, and allows Police to build up criminal intelligence on individuals.

Another area of concern is theft from cars. When shopping please don't leave items unattended and

in full view in the vehicle. It takes only seconds for someone to smash a window, grab something from inside and run off. If you do return to the car with Christmas presents, put them in the boot. If you intend returning to the shops, have a look round the car park first and make sure you're not being watched, before leaving your car.

WINTER DRIVING It is also worth reminding motorists of the extra measures required during the winter. Driving at this time of the year requires extra skills and precautions that motorists often overlook.

- ◆ Preparation is all important. Have your car serviced properly, paying particular attention to anti-freeze, screen wash, tyres, brakes, wipers etc.
- ◆ Make sure that the windows are free of ice before setting off – it is an offence to drive with obscured vision, and the consequences can be disastrous.
- ◆ Remember to allow longer for journeys.
- ◆ Keep your distance from the vehicle in front. If you do, then you are less likely to have to stop faster than you would like.
- ◆ Don't rely solely on the brakes when stopping or slowing down – use a bit less acceleration.
- ◆ When driving on snow or ice, feed the steering wheel gently through your hands.
- ◆ Keep a torch and a spade in the vehicle.
- ◆ Never assume that the road has been treated. It is amazing how many motorists are surprised when the road is icy.

ARNGASK SCHOOL Mr. Simpson has been approached with regard to members of the public giving talks to the children, and is in agreement with this. There are lots of people who have led very interesting lives – maybe they were in the Land Army during the war, captained a ship, or did something else that the children would find exciting. Community Council

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on 2 November 1998, at which two members of the public were present.

BINN FARM Referring to an article mentioned at the last meeting, Cllr. Law explained that she had liaised with SEPA, and was satisfied that allegations made were misleading.

TREASURER'S REPORT The Treasurer reported a sharp increase in expenditure (£368 in the last few months), about which he is concerned with respect to depleting the Council's capital.

POLICE REPORT There had been no overall trend in crime locally, but there had been two serious domestic incidents. The public should be on their guard against bogus workmen. Cllr. Murison mentioned the apparently dangerous parking, particularly in winter, at the bottom of Church Brae, where there are no parking restrictions, but a grit bin may be useful. Cllr. Law suggested that a letter could be sent to the Roads Dept. indicating where grit bins would be most useful.

LIBRARY CLOCK It was agreed that the Community Council would pay £500 towards the

restoration of the clock, with the current owner paying the balance.

REAR OF VILLAGE HALL It was agreed that the Community Council would pay for the provision of fencing and gates for this area, with the Hall committee being asked to take responsibility for organising upkeep. Cllr. Campbell offered to provide a tractor to lay top soil in the area, and volunteers would be asked to help. This would probably be done in the spring.

WEB SITE It was agreed that Glenfarg would benefit from inclusion in the Scottish Towns and Villages website (www.scottish-towns.co.uk), and Cllr. Sutherland would organise this.

AOCB Cllr. Curtis expressed the dissatisfaction of a number of villagers, including himself, with the road works recently carried out on Church Brae. Attention was also drawn to the deterioration in the surface of Greenbank Road, recently repaired. Cllr. Law agreed to liaise with the roads and Transport Department regarding these concerns.

Public Hall Association

The Village Hall extension plans are moving forward very well. The architect has made detailed drawings, which have been submitted for planning permission. We hope that you will take the time to study the plans. An A3 copy is pinned up in the Hall for scrutiny. We would appreciate any comments, which may be sent as letters to the Editor of the Newsletter, or to the Chairman, Mr. Robin Lambie, Bountree, Church Brae. It is in the best interest of all in Glenfarg to get involved, as the Hall forms the heart of the village.

In our plans we are addressing the inaccessibility of the whole hall at present for the ambulant disabled, wheelchair users and visually impaired, and the impractical arrangement of the kitchen and chair store. We hope to open many new opportunities with a portable stage extension, and sound and lighting equipment. A survey will be sent out in the New Year to ascertain the support and potential usage of the "new" Village Hall to the wider community of Glenfarg. We also need community involvement in fund raising efforts, and would welcome anyone with new and fresh ideas.

Stop press We are delighted to have been awarded a grant of £2500 from The Carnegie United Kingdom Trust for use towards the stage extension, props store and portable ramp. A good start indeed!
