## Editorial

# 🎵 HAPPY BIRTHDAY 🎵 DEAR NEWSLETTER



🍷 This edition celebrates the 21<sup>st</sup> birthday of the Newsletter, the actual date, I believe, being last month. Over the years the Newsletter has become one of the characters of the village, and you will see that the cover depicts some of the others: the Post Office, from which the newsletter has always been distributed, John Reid, who was the postmaster at the time of its birth, (or, at least, very soon afterwards) and last, but not least, the venerable Ernie Bateson! Postmasters, editors, typists etc. have come and gone since those early days, but still the Newsletter flourishes. Over the years it has grown from a couple of foolscap sheets stapled together, to the publication you see today.

Once upon a time, many years ago, the Glenfarg Village Folk Club had its own newsletter (still does, of course), and the committee thought what a great idea it would be if the Village had one too. This all happened a very long time ago, long before the days of word processors and other modern conveniences, when things for mass production had to be typed on a stencil, and then churned out using a duplicator. The typing had to be done really carefully, so that the carbon backing to the stencil imprinted the text on the back of the top sheet. Over-enthusiastic typing produced a hole, through which ink could pass, leaving a splodge on the Newsletter. Oh, happy days! It's hard to believe now that we really had to go through that laborious process. The Folk Club had a Gestetner duplicator, which belonged, I believe, to Morag Reid, one of the early members of the Folk Club, and at that time the Chairman of the Community Council. The Folk Club kindly agreed that it should be used for the village Newsletter, and as it lived at Morag's house, up at Middle Deuglie, my husband and other members of the Folk Club committee trooped up there on Friday nights (once a month in those days) and many happy(?) hours were spent turning the handle, and usually getting covered in ink in the process, 200 times for each side. I wonder how much of the amber liquid was consumed at the

same time? At least Middle Deuglie was in walking distance. After Morag left the village the duplicator came to live with us, and the process went on until finally the Newsletter was produced by a professional printer in its A5 format. Contributions often came in late, (so what's new?!) and there was always a last minute panic to get the finished product to John Reid so that he could have it ready to put into the papers on Saturday morning, and still get to bed at a reasonable time.

Maureen Lambie was the first editor, with Morag Reid doing the typing (we think) in the early days, followed by Barbara Tarling. Elspeth Buchan took over the editorship from Maureen, and I am horrified to note that I have been doing it ever since. Doesn't time fly when you're having fun!! It must be high time I gave up – any offers? I think I'm right in saying that Pauline Watson did the typing after Barbara. Is it significant, I ask myself, that Fiona Scott (now Fiona Braid) who also did her share of the typing, is the only Newsletter typist who hasn't left the village?!

All the foregoing has been dredged up from the deep recesses of various people's memories, so if any of it is wrong, or I've missed anyone out, please forgive me, and let me know, so that corrections can be published next time.

I think everyone would agree that the original idea for a village newsletter was a good one, and here's to the next 21 years!

I have just learnt that Riding for the Disabled in Glenfarg celebrates its 25<sup>th</sup> anniversary in November. Many congratulations to everyone who has been involved with it over those years, not least all the horses, and perhaps we could hear a bit about its history, and the anniversary celebrations next time.

Finally, apologies for forgetting to put the library dates in the last Newsletter. I do hope it didn't cause any problems, although I'm sure that everyone who uses the library probably knows far better than I do when it comes!

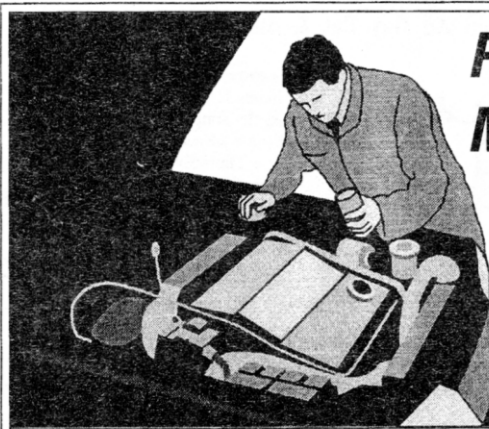

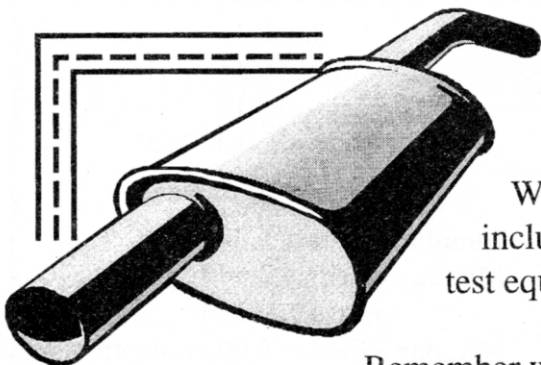

## *Community Council*

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on 3 July, at which three members of the public were present.

### **POLICE REPORT**

PC Steve West reported that police regularly check the Glen for rubbish dumping following publicity in the Perthshire Advertiser and Courier. In addition, SEPA are to check powers of prosecution for those without a "waste" certificate.

Complaints have been made with regard to cattle running free in the locality. It would appear that they may have been let out deliberately, and police believe that children may be involved. PC West has spoken to the local school.

A car (silver Peugeot G479 BHP) was reported stolen from Greenbank Road last weekend.

Grant Smith is the local co-ordinator of the Neighbourhood Watch call out list. Funding is required for eight signs, and Grant would like a meeting to discuss the best position for these signs, and the possibility of collecting subscriptions from residents to fund them.

**MARQUEE** The Marquee has been damaged by damp. A discussion followed regarding its future, and it was noted that Mr. Stewart Smith had done an excellent job towards the letting of the marquee. The cost of repair, purchase of new marquees, and cost of hire were all discussed, and it was decided that a team of volunteers would be required to look after the marquee, conditions for prospective hirers should be drawn up, and payment should be cleared and a bond regarding hire kept as a guarantee. Following the last village fete a complaint had been received from the church representatives involved in the hire of the marquee, who felt there should have been a reduction in cost, as they had had to help take it down. It was pointed out that it was usual for the marquee to be taken down by a group of volunteers with the goodwill of all village groups. A charge of £120 was agreed.

**COMMUNITY CAR** schemes are to be highlighted locally. Ann Munro, Carnbo, is a local organiser.

**AOCB** The path between the garage and the village hall has become overgrown, and Cllr. Baird will investigate.

Cllr. C. Meldrum reported a crumbling wall at the north end of the village, and Cllr. Baird will also investigate this.

Horse droppings had been seen on the motorway footbridge, and horse owners will be asked to tidy up.

The following is an extract from the minutes of the Community Council meeting held on 4 September.

At the beginning of the meeting Cllr. J. McHardy, Chairman, reported the sad death of villager Mr. W. Meldrum, after an illness. Best wishes and condolences were expressed to his wife, Christian.

**ARNGASK FOOTBRIDGE** Repairs have been completed, and the bridge now appears to be in good order.

**MARQUEE** The cost of repair has been obtained, and it was agreed that the estimates seemed reasonable. It was felt, however, that the marquee would not look as attractive, and so would just be for village use. Information to be sought on the cost of a second-hand marquee.

**FOOTBALL CLUB** A complaint had been received regarding foul language used by players during, and litter left behind after, a recent match in Wallace Park. Mr. C. Archibald (trainer and representative of the club) was present at the meeting, and agreed to act on the concerns. Cllr. McHardy made it clear that the problem had been passed to Perth & Kinross Council, and that locals would not tolerate repeated instances.

**AOCB** The Community Council is to sponsor one of the months in the Glenfarg Badminton Club Calendar, proceeds from the sale of which will go to the Village Hall extension fund.

Cllr. Reid reported continued problems with holes at the garage end of the fencing around the Village Hall. Cllr. Murison offered to repair them.

Cllr. Sutherland requested that the Council should support a drive for low cost smaller housing in the Glenfarg area. Cllr. Baird reported that Perth & Kinross Council is keen to promote more affordable housing, and Glenfarg and Abernethy are both on the agenda. She agreed to pursue the matter.

**OFFICE BEARERS** Cllrs. McHardy and Webb have both intimated, for personal reasons, their intentions to stand down in the near future. It is hoped that other members of the community may come forward to be Councillors or Office Bearers by April, to ensure the continuity of the Community Council. Anyone interested should contact Rachel Webb, Secretary.

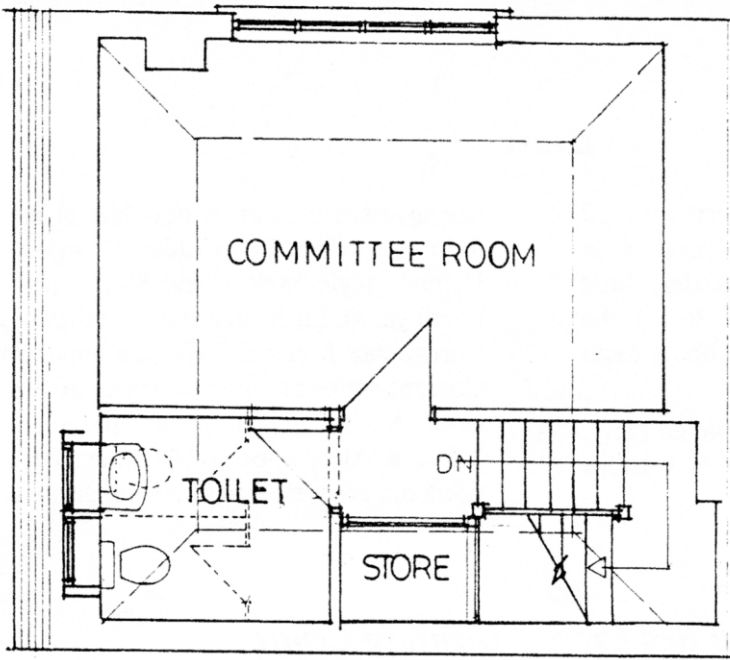

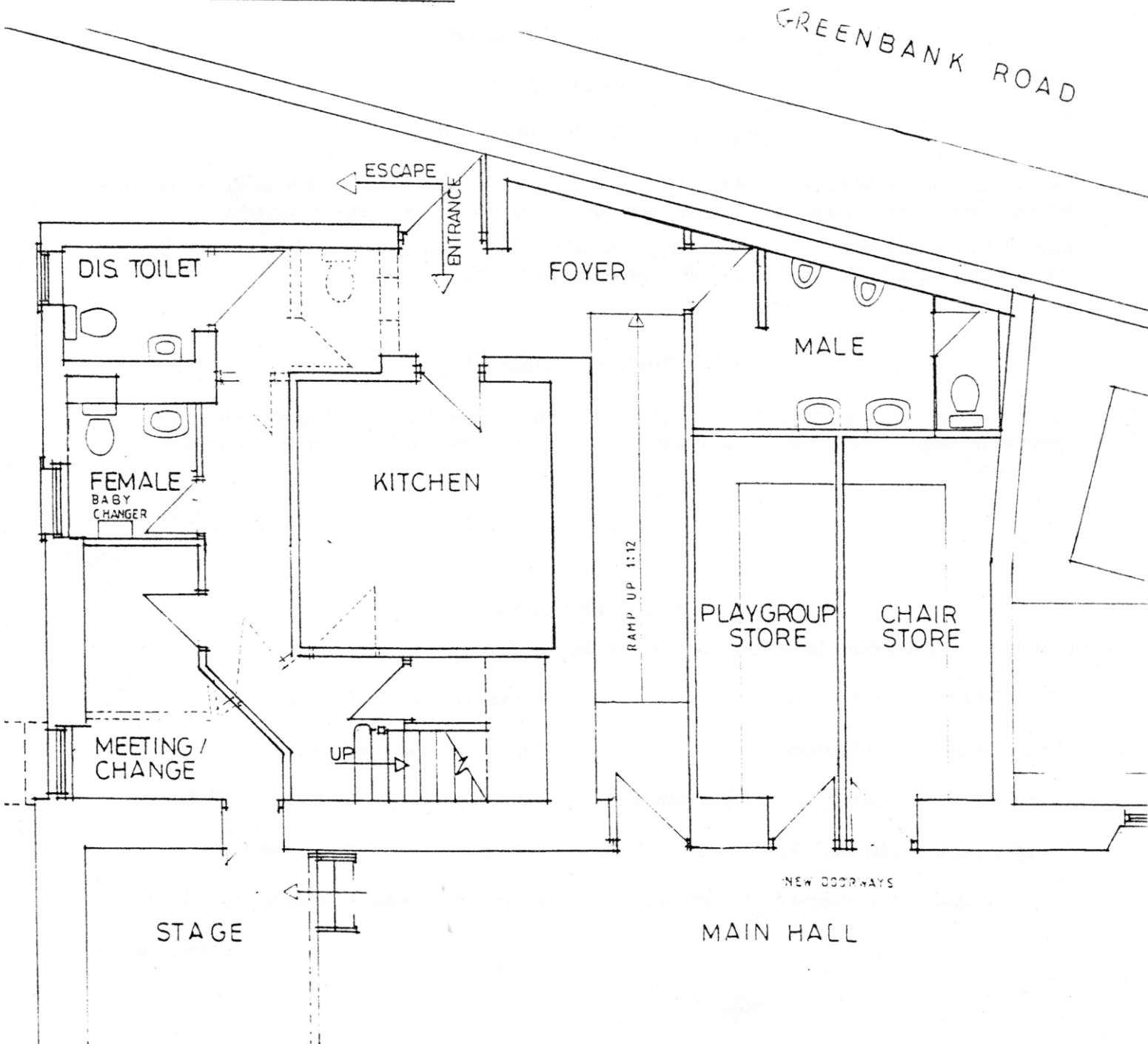

Anyone telephoning between 8.15am and 10am, other than to make an appointment or to ask for a house call, may be asked to call back after 10am. We have three telephone lines taking incoming calls, and prefer to keep them all free for appointments during this period of peak patient demand.

Surgery consultations are strictly by appointment only. Patients presenting as urgent cases (to relieve pain or suffering) will be seen the same day as an emergency appointment, but it may not be with the doctor with whom you are registered. Routine appointments will be given the first available time, and if this is not suitable, an earlier appointment with another one of the doctors of the same practice may be offered. Please let us know when you have to cancel an appointment, in order that we may offer it to another patient.

If you are unable to attend the surgery and need the doctor to visit you at home, please telephone Kinross 862112 before 10am whenever possible. Please remember that home visits are for serious illnesses and people who cannot travel to the Health Centre - the doctor can see 3 or 4 patients at the surgery in the time it takes to do one home visit.
