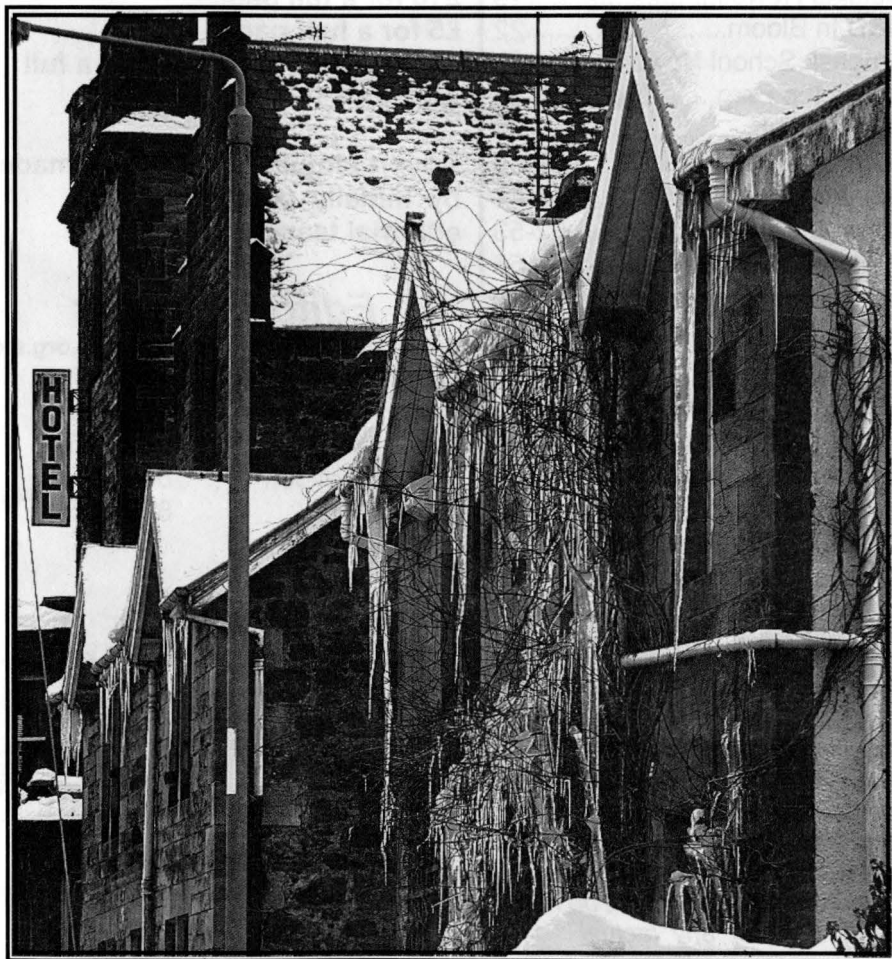

At least with snow we can pretend we like it – take on a sort of British stoicism, a *joie de vivre* through the cold and mush. As I'm writing this I'm also listening to the news

and wondering how on earth we can think we've had a hard time of it...

With that sober thought, I can happily say to Glenfarg and the surrounding community "Happy New Year" because we don't need to look too far beyond our troubles to count our joys.

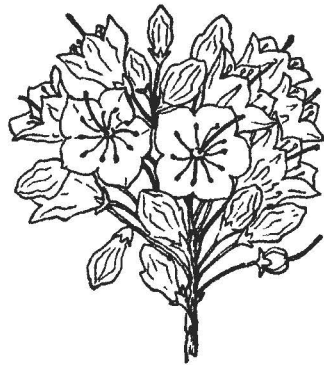

Glenfarg Group Riding For The Disabled Association.

The Group would like to thank the Wine Club for their generous donation. This will go towards providing our riders with hats and games equipment and some expenses incurred when travelling to events and competitions.

Glenfarg Group RDA was started in 1975 with 10 riders from Cherrybank School in Perth.

We now have over 60 riders every week during the school term from most of the schools in the Perth and Kinross area.

The disabilities range from autism, behavioural problems, learning disabilities, Downs syndrome to many physical problems where a pony's four legs are more use to them than two which don't work!

All riders are encouraged to take Proficiency Tests and Endeavour Awards which include Riding and Horse Knowledge and Care. They start at basic Grade 1-4 to Bronze, Silver and Gold awards for our experienced riders.

We took two riders to Leeds in July to take part in a Bronze test course, which they passed and are hoping to return next year to try for silver.

We also compete in Special Olympics, Dressage, and Story to Music Competitions. We also take riders to Clwyd Special Riding Centre in Wales on a riding holiday.

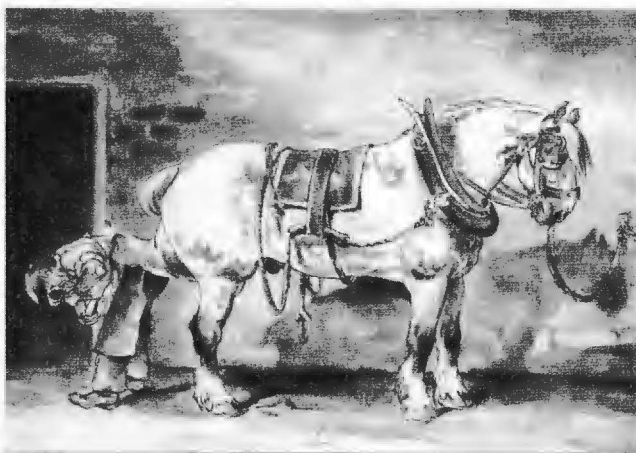

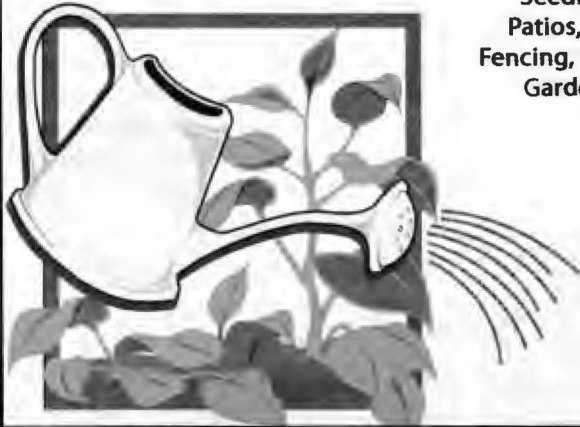

POLICE BOX

Welcome to a regular new feature in the Glenfarg Newsletter, the Police Box. This will endeavour to provide you with the latest information relating to crime in the Glenfarg area. It will also offer crime prevention advice and make you aware of any upcoming initiatives being run by Tayside Police.

COMMUNITY CRIME OFFICER



Following a recent staff reorganisation, Constable Euan Mitchell has now taken over the responsibilities of being the Community Crime Officer for the Glenfarg area. Euan will also cover similar duties in the Cleish/Blairadam and Fossoway areas.

Also available to be contacted at Kinross Police Station are Constable Ishbel Wallace and Constable Brian Easton who will cover the Kinross and Milnathort/Portmoak areas respectively.

MOBILE COMMUNITY OFFICE



Tayside Police are very keen to be part of the Community and with our new team of Community Crime Officers working within Kinross and the surrounding areas, we would like to reach out to the more rural communities and engage with residents to make these officers more accessible and to provide public reassurance.

To help us achieve this we now have a Mobile Community Office. This will be available in Glenfarg on a monthly

basis. The Mobile Office service will initially be on a trial basis to gauge the use of it within the community, and it is hoped it will be well used. Should demand be there, it may be possible to extend it to more frequent visits and also to widen the service to cover other areas.

It will be available in Glenfarg between 1300 and 1630 hours on the following dates:

Tuesday 16th February 2010.

Tuesday 16th March 2010.

Tuesday 20th April 2010.

Further dates will be made available nearer the time.

The service will also be available in Crook of Devon, Kinnesswood and Milnathort as part of this trial.

ASSISTANCE FROM THE PUBLIC

We would urge members of the public to inform us of all incidents when they happen. Very often people are reluctant to “get involved” because of preconceived ideas that they will be targeted and anticipate reprisals. However this very rarely, if ever, happens and is viewed very seriously by the courts if it does. In any case, although it is more help to the police for witnesses to give their details, an anonymous call to report a crime being committed or to report suspicious behaviour or noises is better than no call at all. When

deciding whether to call the police to report incidents such as those described above, we would ask members of the public to consider how they would feel if they were the victim, and that somebody who had been in a position to help them did nothing.

We are frequently told about incidents days or even weeks after they happen, usually when the person reporting happens to meet one of us in the street or at a meeting and we are asked “what are you doing about youths hanging about our street” or similar “it’s happening every night”. We then find that the incident described has either happened several days before or has been going on for several weeks. It considerably lessens the possibility to effectively deal with an incident if we are not informed at the time and makes it impossible if we do not know at all.

NOMINATED NEIGHBOUR SCHEME

Tayside Police and its Community Safety partners in Perth and Kinross run a scheme to assist efforts in preventing bogus caller crime. The Nominated Neighbour initiative provides residents with added reassurance and help older people and vulnerable members of our community to feel safer in their own homes. Funded by the Community Safety Partnership, the scheme will be

coordinated by Tayside Police in Perth. It is an initiative that has already proved successful in a number of other police areas throughout the UK.

Through the scheme, residents are provided with an A4-size card that they can hold up to a window or show through the gap in the door when a cold caller arrives at their door. The card states: 'I do not recognise you! Please go to number XX who is my nominated neighbour. They will check your identity and return with you.' The caller can then go to the Nominated Neighbour, who checks their identity and if they are genuine return to the resident's home. They will stay with the caller throughout the duration of their visit.

The aim of the scheme is to give householders, in particular the elderly and more vulnerable, the opportunity to deal with unwanted callers without having to take decisions on their own, or even having to enter into direct conversation with them. The Nominated Neighbour is chosen freely by the householder and should always be readily available. We are confident that this will greatly reduce the chances of the householder entering into any contract, having unnecessary or overpriced work carried out, or giving out cash unnecessarily.

Furthermore, it is anticipated that this reinforced approach will scare away the bogus callers and criminals who will not want to stick around and be identified by more than one person. At the heart of the scheme is the ethos of being a good neighbour. Any genuine caller will follow the instructions given on the card and contact the Nominated Neighbour. Unscrupulous callers will be deterred.

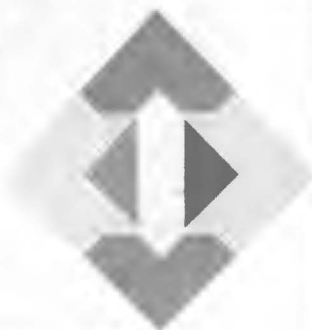

Glenfarg & Duncrervie In Bloom

Looking forward to Spring flowers!

It's hard to think of anything In Bloom as we gaze out on a snow white landscape but since my daffodils were through the ground before December's snow fall, you can bet your bottom dollar that once again Glenfarg and Duncrervie will be awash with spring flowers very soon.

This year will see the results of the autumn planting along the Duncrervie road and the increase of bulbs along the south verge.
