

There were energetic tennis games, giant inflatables, adorable farmyard animals (including goats and chicks) and produce from Arngask Farm, arts & crafts, wonderful home-baking stall (overflowing with treats from our parent group), beat the goalie (ably manned by our high school Colts team members), and the hilarious win-a-pig competition. The setting was perfect with glorious sunshine, the smell of Fraser's Woodfired Pizzas, and



happy chatter from the Pub in the Park.

Who organised it?

What was your favourite part?

Seeing so many families out and so many kids having fun. There were 80 tickets sold before the day which was amazing as people had planned in advance to come. In total we sold 90 tickets and under-2's went free so there were lots of toddlers who hadn't started school yet. There were also



families from outwith the village which was so encouraging!

Where did the funds go?

Well, we made £1148 in profit from it which was fantastic because, to begin with, we didn't even know if we would cover our costs. We had about £450 of expenses and that was for the prizes for games and the inflatables. The profits go into the Parent Council bank account and will ultimately go to support different things for the children. It was agreed that £668 will go towards the new playground lines (that were mainly funded by foundation Scotland). The other £480 paid for bus travel for

the whole school (including nursery) to go to the deer centre for their summer trip they had on 27th June.



Would you do it again?

Yes. There was a good range of activities for kids and we've got a few ideas of what we would do differently next year. We're hoping for the event to be a annual celebration, given the success of the fundraising and the positive feedback we've had.

Glenfarg Community Transport Group

There are lots of exciting developments to report from the GCTG this quarter. Buckle up, because this community project is definitely not running out of gas! We have received excellent media coverage including a small item on BBC News. Along with articles in most of the national newspapers. Our amazing group of volunteer trustees and board members are showing no sign of a U-turn as they keep things moving forward, quite literally! And, of course, our amazing bus drivers and passengers ,who are the driving force behind this vibrant community link, are keeping us all on track!We also have a whole new look—with an updated logo and branding which emphasises our green priorities.

In early September, the new website - GlenfargCT.co.uk—should be going live! This will have pages for **The 55 Bus** timetables and **The Community Bus** bookings calendar. There will also be dedicated pages for walking and wheeling too, as we want to embrace Active Travel. Watch this space for information about Glenfarg's forthcoming Accessible and Sustainable Transport plan and consultation events too. Please note that our existing presence on Glenfarg.org will continue until the new site is established.

The 55 Bus

You can be sure of a warm welcome from David, one of our new drivers, who has recently moved to the village. It seems that all roads, quite literally, lead to Glenfarg!

The GCTC is now shifting gears, as they are trial two additions to The 55 Bus service.

The first service from Glenfarg will now be 0710 and this will connect with the 0737 Ember E1 Service to Edinburgh. This will be under review at the end September when

Ember publishes their new timetables. It will provide a valuable link for commuters who are keen to reduce car usage and residents of Milnathort and Kinross will also be able to use the bus to get round to the Park & Ride.



In the morning, The Gateside Shuttle will run Monday to Friday starting in Strathmiglo at 0805, calling in at Gateside at 0810 and connect with The 55 Bus heading south at Mawcarse Crossroads at 0815, arriving at Loch Leven Community Campus at 0822. The return service will run Monday-Thursday and depart the Campus at 1553, connect at Mawcarse with the return Gateside Shuttle at 1600, arriving in Gateside at 1605 and Strathmiglo at 1610. Fares will be charged on The 55 Bus sector but the Gateside Shuttle is free for the duration of the trial. Anyone from the villages can travel – 8 passengers maximum.

Glenfarg Water Treatment Works—Major Project

Planning Reference—23/01353/FLL



In response to the above application, The Community Council in Glenfarg held a public meeting on Wednesday 30th August to discuss concerns in respect of the intended works. There were over 50 residents in attendance representing a variety of locations and interests throughout the village.

It is reasonable to say that the unanimous feeling within the meeting was of serious concerns over the lack of information within the documents presented in the planning portal, which leads to major worries over health and safety of the villagers and the catastrophic effect on the wildlife and ecology of the area surrounding and adjacent to the site. There is no doubt that the intended works will result in significant disruption within the village.

Initial thoughts are that this may not be the correct place for such a project. Once completed, if there were to be a major incident at Glenfarg WTW then this would close down the whole supply system. Surely

if there were a booster station downstream this would provide enhanced resilience to the overall system. Currently there are tankers transferring water to St Andrews which would highlight the need to have an option in the centre of the network

Traffic Management

- Change of junction priorities at Ladeside / Greenbank Rd / Duncrevie Rd. This is a particularly dangerous idea. This is in the centre of the village and is a school walking route
- 20-30 HGVs a week and possibly per day at peak project times. Along Ladeside and up Church Brae keeping up speed for momentum. No details on monitoring this.
- Dangers with passing places / speed of vehicles/ competency of escort vehicles / volume of traffic. How will all of this be managed and supervised?

Ecology

- History of the River Farg being contaminated by the WTW
- Several rare species such as bats, red squirrels and pinemartins. No details of how these will be protected
- Disruption in the location of a beaver set. No indication of protections to be put in place.

These lists are just an indication of some concerns. The Community Council have lodged a three page letter of objection which can be viewed on the planning portal. All local residents attending the meeting were urged to lodge an objection.

A further meeting will take place on Sept 19th with Scottish Water and the CC to go through concerns raised.

Glenfarg Freewheelers

Glenfarg Freewheelers is a group of community members who are keen to promote and support the use of e-bikes in the community.

Following a very successful trial of an e-bike loan scheme we are in the process of applying for funding to purchase a range of e-bikes to suit a variety of users and uses.

We are linking closely with Glenfarg Community Transport Group and Greener Glenfarg.

Our aim is to:

- Provide access to e-bikes, safety equipment and accessories for all members of the community
- Encourage active travel, reduce car use and improve health and well-being
- Encourage and support young families to cycle together and to access local towns and countryside
- support members to access employment and places of work
- support linking with local and National bus services by providing folding bikes and bike storage
- provide access to training for bike maintenance and promote safe cycling

Great initiative for local residents who



Glenfarg Community Centre School House Opening 2nd December

Work has progressed slowly in the schoolhouse to prepare it for a Grand Opening and Christmas Fayre on Saturday 2nd December.

A huge thanks to Glenfarg Gala Committee for the donation of £1,000 and the boys in the shop for raising £400 to cover the cost of flooring the Arngask room. Its incredibly expensive as the floors have to be lined with plywood first.



Our first booking was Glenfarg Community Transport Group who have named the schoolhouse as their main office, they initially occupied Fordel but are now upstairs in Arngask. The next was mindfulness sessions and now the pop up pub will be using Candy and Duncrievie.

Only two upstairs rooms (Fordel, Deuglie) and the toilet need to be decorated before we floor the remaining upstairs rooms. Easterton is decorated but needs new flooring. Downstairs the kitchen needs finished. We are booking a professional to decorate the stairwell, since it reached the roofline its above our abilities to decorate.

To assist with booking rooms in the schoolhouse the room names will appear on the booking calendar when in use.

Many thanks to Tim, Tara, Gillian, Alice and Janet for helping with the decorating and to Janet, Steve and Bill for working at the weeds.

From October 7th, there will be "Saturdays at the Schoolhouse". A weekly Pub Night from 5.30pm to 10.30pm.

The Catchup Queen

We've been in the village for about 19 years but somehow we had never visited this local place until recently. I know from friends that it is hugely popular in the area and it's somewhat of a local institution – Mona's of Muckhart. It's now owned by the niece of the previous owners and is named after Mona, her great grandmother. They currently boast over 1.400 followers on their Facebook page, with an average rating of 4.8 out of 5.



Located on the right of the main street as you pass through Pool of Muckhart from the east, there's a handy car park at the back and some on-street parking, too. There's full disabled access and there's outdoor seating too for warmer days.

The first thing that struck us when we arrived for lunch was the warm welcome we received as soon as we

arrived, which is always a good sign and puts you instantly at ease. The interior was brightly decorated and clean. We were lucky that it wasn't full as we were able to have a bigger table – a pet hate of ours is the tiny tables you're sometimes given when there's just two of you. We hadn't booked but there wasn't a problem that day although I would imagine that booking might be advisable on more popular days of the week.

There was a good selection of lunch-time snacks but also a choice of main course dishes if you have a larger appetite. We both ordered sandwiches – him indoors choosing prawn Marie Rose on white bread, and I chose my all-time favourite filling, coronation chicken on seeded brown bread. Both were absolutely delicious, tasted really fresh, and



came with a decent amount of salad and coleslaw. We felt that the menu was very reasonably priced, always a bonus nowadays.

As we were there in the expectation that I'd be able to include Mona's in this review, I insisted we had to try at least one item of baking from the varied selection on offer, although we were pretty full after our sandwiches. We shared a piece of traybake between us and it was most satisfactory. The coffee also tasted very good. I can't stand really strong, bitter coffee and was relieved that theirs was very drinkable.

If I'd been catching up with a girlfriend I would, of course, have taken time to look at their gift shop but on this occasion, it was time to go as soon as we'd finished our lunch, but I did spy some really lovely looking scarves so a return visit is definitely on the cards. It looks a great wee place for gift ideas.

GREENER GLENFARG UPDATE

Our consultation earlier in the year resulted in some great ideas on how we could move towards being a greener village. Here is an update on how those ideas have been taken forward.

Glenfarg Freewheelers: Home Energy Scotland suggested that we organise a Sustainable Travel workshop, as a result of which we were loaned 3 e-bikes for the use of members of the community. Thanks to Tara, the e-bike loan scheme has been a great success, with the three bikes in almost constant use. However, these bikes had to be returned to Home Energy Scotland at the end of the loan period. A group, the Glenfarg Freewheelers, was therefore formed to take forward the establishment of a permanent scheme. You can read about it elsewhere in this newsletter. They also have a section on the new Glenfarg Community Transport website. Well done, Glenfarg Freewheelers!

Clothes Swap: Following on from the successful

Clothes Swap in the spring, we have now organised an autumn event to be held at the coffee lounge on Thursday 28th September. So have a look through your wardrobe and bring along items you no longer wear but which are in good enough condition to be of use to someone else. But, more importantly, come along on the day to find items to take away to wear. Remember, we are trying to purchase less new items – their manufacture results in an enormous cost to the environment in terms of chemicals, water, plastics, transport etc.

Binn Eco Park Liaison: A meeting has been arranged to hear about the recent exciting developments at the Binn Eco Park and to explore ways in which we might work together.

Tool Share: The response to this scheme has been disappointing so far, just the offer of a few garden tools with 3 being borrowed. We intend to advertise again in the autumn and maybe be able to add some DIY equipment to the list. The aim is that, by sharing what we have, we lessen the amount of new equipment that is purchased.

Repair Shop: It was felt that our community was too small to sustain a full Repair Shop, which might require premises, insurance, and possibly the purchase of equipment. The option of liaising with the Kinross Men's Shed is being explored.

Flood Mitigation: a few members of the group met with Flooding Engineers from PKC. They have arranged for details of contacts for different circumstances and FAQs to be issued to ourselves. As climate change is likely to bring more episodes of heavy rain, it was felt sensible to explore possible methods of flood mitigation. A visit to a rewilding project, which includes methods of flood mitigation, is being organised for September.

Kinross Climate Café: This takes place on the first Tuesday of the month in the Campus Library. Each meeting has a guest speaker on a subject of interest. Glenfarg has been invited to speak about our push towards more sustainable lifestyles.

Phyllipa Fogg's Traveller's Tales

The Trans-Siberian Railway: Part 1

In the summer of 1979, my sister and I decided to take the opportunity to travel home from East to West on the Trans-Siberian Railway: now one of the luxury train journeys of the world; then merely a means of transport for Russian people. One carriage was reserved for foreigners and rules had to be followed: no cameras or photography. We had our own 'train lady' who frequently checked on us and, in the evening, made up our beds on the seats with spotless white sheets and pillows. A samovar* at the end of the corridor was regularly filled with hot water. Our travelling companions were two Australian girls and a couple from New Zealand.

We flew from Niigata in Japan to Khabarovsk in Russia where we boarded the train. The engine was a massive steam locomotive: the carriages, equally massive with at least 4 steps and handrails to ascend and descend. A timetable in Russian was displayed to indicate stops and times of arrival and departure at each station. On the platform at most stations there would be locals selling their wares: eggs, veg, home baking, milk in a variety of bottles, secured at the tops with newspaper!! Occasionally unscheduled stops would occur when the Russian passengers would descend to gather bunches of wild flowers which grew profusely on the banks. These were put in bottles or other containers to adorn the window ledges of the carriages.

We found the landscape fascinating; vast swathes of grasslands and the occasional herder on horseback was sighted. This gave way to birch forests and, now and then, a very rare sighting of a cluster of small wooden houses set around a well. We felt certain this must be Chekhov country, and somewhere in the forest was Dachau.

After two days, we arrived at Irkutsk where we had reserved hotel accommodation for one night in order to visit Lake Baikal, the world's largest fresh water lake!! We immediately had a shower (not available on the train) before our tour coach arrived. On our return to the hotel, we were looking forward to our comfortable beds but we were told at reception "Niet, you go back on the train tonight!"

The next train was slightly more comfortable, and so we began the final leg of our 6,000 mile journey to Moscow where we had the frightening experience of being followed by the K.G.B.

But that's another story for Part 2!



I recently went on my Duke of Edinburgh Gold Practice Expedition. I was in a group of 9 young adults who were a great team to conquer the Cairngorms with. I completed my Silver Award with the same group last year and so it was just another adventure for us as a our little DofE family.

On the first day, we had a 6km ascent into Glen Callater. This was tough going and reality set in as to what we had signed ourselves up for. The night was windy which was great as there were no midges to bother us. Another bonus was that there was no light pollution, so the stars were fantastic. We had a lovely sociable night, and I had high hopes for what the rest of the expedition would hold. I got to have my own one-man tent to sleep in and even had my own wee hot water bottle, so all was well with the world.



On top of the world!

On the second day, we climbed a Corbet called M orven (which means 'Big Hill' in Gaelic), which was a Corbett (but not far off a Munro!) I was carrying 15kg on my back and my legs felt the pain! It's a relentless climb, with the path veering up and up, making us scramble at crazy angles to keep moving forward. To make matters worse, we were caught in heavy rain which soaked us to the pants and the wind gusts blew us sideways. When we miraculously made it to the top, we received the gift of 4G which we had been deprived of for 24 hours. My first thought was that my Duolingo streak needed tended to. Duo doesn't wait for anyone, even if they're on DofE! With my streak and physical energy refuelled, we set off down the other side of the hill to our next campsite with high hopes for what the night would hold. We were welcomed with a boggy marsh in a little clearing in the forest just off a path. There was a river next to it, and it was enclosed by a forest on all sides so there was no air flow. And no air flow meant bugs. And so, with no visible flat ground or decent place to cook our meals, we all looked at each other in bewilderment. Surely this wasn't the place we were going to camp for the night? Luckily, our leaders arrived soon after, and led us away from that clearing back up the path we had come from. Now able to tell where we were on the map, the leaders promptly brought us right back down the path again and did in fact inform us that that bog

hole would be where we were going to be for the night. The “true” DofE experience we were told! We were all pretty sullen (and soggy) that night while anything and everything swarmed us. Even our midgie nets were only so useful as it’s difficult to eat dinner with a midgie net on!

On the third day we went over another hill (with no name) into Glen Ey where we were on the homestretch of our expedition with only a few kilometers left. Thankfully, I made it through as I had a very supportive team who helped me get my bag on my shoulders, and who helped me literally get back up on my feet. Two girls and I walked into the public bathroom, and were greeted with a wall length mirror above the sinks. We just gawked in horror. We looked ROUGH! As if we’d been dragged by the hair, through the heather and ditches of the Cairngorms by an enraged Highland cow!

However, overall, the experience and comradery was one I am grateful for and will never forget: for reasons good and bad! Oh yes, and I’ll do it all again—and more! - two weeks later, for my Qualifying Expedition which is 3 nights away and 4 days hiking. Now, where did I put my midge net?




